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DOCTORS WILL BE ASKING PATIENTS IF THEY OWN RIFLES, HANDGUNS, OR AMMUNITION

I had my 'fellow activist' who gave me this information confirm what she told me previously today , which was that the doctor's office asked her friend these three questions when he went in for his check up:

1. Have you been out of the country in the last 30 days?
2. Have you been out of the state in the last 30 days?
3. Do you have any rifles, hand guns, or ammunition?

Number 3 was a shocker. He was not being given, nor was he using, any prescription for medicine that would make him disoriented or suicidal. There was no reason for the doctor to ask Question #3.

This has all been verified. Yes, we know the name of the doctor and he is located in California above the San Francisco/Oakland part of the state. His office nurse willingly obliged by stating that "This is the new operational statistical form they will be using from now on. They "started using it two weeks ago" she said. The nurse called her own source that originally sent her these questions to be asked of the patients.

She asked the original source: "Why are you asking these kinds of questions?" She was told that they are going to be doing this kind of questioning from now on.
